PUBLIC COMPUTER USE POLICY

The Alaska State Court Law Library provides legal research computers to access government and other legal resources available on the Internet. The Internet has a wealth of resources, and the library cannot be responsible for its content. You should critically evaluate the information you find for accuracy, completeness, and currency. You may encounter offensive material.

User Responsibilities:

Please comply with the following Public Computer Use Guidelines or you may lose your computer privileges. Library staff can provide basic assistance only.

- Library computers are for legal research only. You may not use library computers to access anything not connected to legal research, including social media, games, and video streaming.
- You may not use library equipment for any illegal activity, nor may you use our equipment to offend, harass, intimidate, or threaten anyone.
- You may not alter the configuration of or otherwise damage the equipment.
- If all computers are occupied and someone is waiting to use a computer, use will be limited to 30 minutes.
- Provided the computer is set up to allow it, you may download or e-mail library materials, so long as the material is in the public domain or is non-copyrighted.
- You may only use one computer at a time and no more than two people may share a computer station.
- The Law Library charges for printing from the public computers. The first 10 pages per day are free. After that, the charge is 25¢ per page. One copy of Alaska Court forms may be printed for free. Print jobs can be retrieved from the library staff at the Reference Desk. All printing must be completed and paid for at least 10 minutes prior to closing.
- Violation of these policies may lead to suspension of library privileges. Persistent infractions of the General Library Policies may lead to permanent suspension of library privileges.
