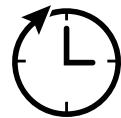

Learn More

Go to ak-courts.info/akodr to learn more about AK ODR. The FAQs have general information and information for both claimants and respondents. There are also worksheets to help you get started.



Create an Account

Go to AK ODR to create an account and start your case. AK ODR works best on a computer and not on a mobile device. Visit your local law library (in the courthouse) if you need access to a computer.



Knowledge Base

Navigate to the Knowledge Base. The Knowledge Base has the answers to all your AK ODR questions. The Knowledge Base has information about platform works and what steps you should take next.



Messaging, Templates, and Document Sharing

Send the other side any documents you think are important. Use the Messaging feature to understand the other side's point of view. Use the Template feature to draft an agreement and send it to the other side.



Mediator

If you're stuck and can't seem to come to an agreement, often times a mediator can help. A mediator is neutral person who helps you reach an agreement to resolve your dispute. The mediator will communicate with both parties and help draft an agreement.



Court Order

If you reach an agreement, you can ask a judge to sign the agreement and make it a court order. If you do not already have an open court case there is a \$25 fee to open one and send the agreement to the judge.
