ORDER NO. 1146

Amending Alaska Bar Rule 5 concerning attorney's oath of admission.

IT IS ORDERED:

1. Section 3 of Bar Rule 5 is amended to provide:

Section 3. Upon receiving certification of the eligibility of an applicant the Supreme Court may enter an order admitting the applicant as an attorney at law in all the courts of the state and to membership in the Alaska Bar Association. Each applicant ordered admitted to the practice of law shall take the following oath before a judicial officer of the State of Alaska:

I will maintain the confidence and preserve inviolate the secrets of my client, and will accept no compensation in connection with [HIS] <u>my client's</u> business except from [HIM] <u>my client</u> or with [HIS] <u>my client's</u> knowledge or approval; Supreme Court Order No. <u>1146</u> Effective Date: <u>September 9, 1993</u> Page 2
