## IN THE SUPREME COURT OF THE STATE OF ALASKA ORDER NO. 1902

Revising Bar Rule 44 extending to twelve months the period a legal intern permit is valid.

## IT IS ORDERED:

Bar Rule 44 section 6 is amended to read as follows:

Rule 44. Legal Interns.

\* \* \* \*

**Section 6. Termination of Permit.** A permit shall cease to be effective as follows:

- (a) For a law student who obtains a permit under Section 3(b) of this rule, upon the expiration of a period of <u>eight\_twelve\_months</u> in cumulative time that the intern participates in any acts authorized by the permit in any Alaska court; this cumulative time limit may be divided into two or three separate time periods if appropriate for the law student's schedule:
- (b) For a law school graduate who obtains a permit under Section 3(c) of this rule, upon the expiration of a period of ten months from the date of issuance, or upon the failure of the intern to pass any bar examination administered by Alaska or any other state of the United States or the District of Columbia.
