Amending Appellate Rule 513.5(b): Type Size.

IT IS ORDERED:

- 1. Appellate Rule 513.5(b) is amended to provide:
- (b) Form in General. Except as provided in subsection (a), all papers and documents, including exhibits thereto, presented for filing with the clerk (1) shall be on letter size white paper of good quality, of at least sixteen pound weight, and not onionskin except where ripple finish or other opaque paper is used, in which event the weight shall be at least thirteen pound; (2) shall be two-hole punched at the center of the top of each page; (3) shall be either in clear and legible typewriting with black ribbon, or in clear and legible printing; (4) shall be in double-spaced or one-and-one-half-spaced typewriting or printing, except that quotations shall be single spaced and indented; (5) shall be printed or written upon only one side of the paper, and (6) shall, if consisting of more than one page, have each page numbered consecutively at the bottom center of the page. All printed or typewritten matter must appear in at least 11 point type, 10 pitch (10 characters per inch).
- 2. Paragraph (d) of Appellate Rule 513.5 is deleted.
